Local districts are given the option to select other eligible families and provide services for these families as long as they have funds available and they have selected these options in their Child and Families Services Plan. These optional categories do not fall under the child care guarantee and are not required by the state to provide child care services, but may receive a child care subsidy as long as the district has funds available. Local social services districts must verify the applicants'/recipients' employment status, family size, residence, and gross annual income among other factors to see that a family is eligible for a child care subsidy.
