Introduction

This report was prepared in fulfillment of the reporting requirements contained in the Welfare Reform Act of 1997, and was compiled by the Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) with data developed by OTDA, the Department of Health (DOH) and the Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS).¹ Although the law requires that reporting should begin upon the completion of the redesign of the Welfare Management System and the completion of the Welfare-to-Work Caseload Management System (CMS), recent improvements in our data infrastructure, including the continued development of the Welfare Reporting and Tracking System (WRTS), allow us to report on a large proportion of the required data using currently available sources. As our data structure continues to improve, we will increase both the quality and quantity of our reporting.

Except where otherwise noted, the time period covered in this report is July 2006 through June 2007 (referred to as the report year). This time period was selected to allow for the compilation of a years worth of data prior to the end of calendar year issuance date of the report.


What follows is a brief summary of current trends in the Temporary Assistance caseload for the July 2006 to June 2007 time period, and a high level summary of the data supplied in the main body of the report.

Recent Caseload Trends

Figure 1 illustrates the trend in total Temporary Assistance (TA) recipients for the July 2006 to June 2007 period. During this time, the total recipient count decreased by 34,956, from 566,263 to 531,307 or 6.2%. This percentage decrease exceeds that observed over the same period one year previous, where there was a decrease of 24,821 recipients, or 4.1%. We have experienced a fairly steady downward trend in total TA recipients since May of 2004. Historically, the recipient count for June is the lowest since November 1963, and significantly below the all-time peak recipient count of 1,661,331 attained in April 1994.



The reduction in recipient counts over the last year has varied across case classifications. Specifically, caseload reductions in “family” cases have been somewhat larger than those in the “singles” category. Figure 2 shows the recipient count change for the report period for “family” cases as a whole, and for each of this category’s components: 1) recipients in the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) program (which in turn consists of Family Assistance (FA) and a small number of federally funded Safety Net Assistance (SNA) families where an adult in the case is mandated to drug treatment), and 2) former TANF cases in the SNA program by virtue of exceeding the TANF 60 month time limit or being barred from TANF receipt due to their alien status. These cases are referred to as SNA Maintenance of Effort (SN MOE) cases because expenditures on these cases, while not TANF eligible, count toward a state’s requirement to maintain a certain level of historical assistance expenditures on families in order to access their TANF block grant funds.

July 2006 to June 2007**




Note that for this year the families recipient counts include persons in non-disabled two-parent cases, even though these cases were moved into the SN Non-MOE case category in October 2006 for the purposes of avoiding the risk of federal penalty for failure to meet extremely high work participation rates for this group. Such cases are distributed between the TANF and SN MOE lines on Figure 2 based on the classification the case would have been in had they not been shifted.

There was a 31,565 or 7.6% decrease in the number of recipients in the family case category. This decrease was the result of a 23,297 or 8.1% recipient decrease in TANF, and an 8,268 or 6.4% decrease in the SN MOE category.

Figure 3 shows the recipient count for “traditional” Safety Net Assistance cases, usually referred to as “singles” cases since they consist primarily of one-person adult cases.² There was a 3,391 or 2.3% recipient decrease in this category, from 148,424 to 145,033. This decrease is in contrast to the increase observed in the prior report year’s increase of recipients in this category.

² For various programmatic reasons, there are also a number of cases with children in the portion of the SNA caseload that has not timed out from TANF. These cases are part of the analysis of the “singles” caseload. There are also some cases with children in this caseload due to improper coding of case type.

Report Summary

This summary, and the report as a whole, is organized by section headings that refer directly by letter to the subsections of the reporting requirements in statute. In some cases, reporting requirements for a particular section overlap with those in other sections. When this occurs, appropriate cross-references will be provided in the body of the report.

Section (a): Applications

Section (a) provides district level and statewide information on the number of applications approved, withdrawn and denied, and the reasons for denials, for TA as a whole and for the FA and SNA categories. These numbers are summarized in Table 1. Of all applications processed, 48.1% were approved, 17.6% were withdrawn and 34.2% were denied. These rates are very similar for the FA and SNA categories.

The main reasons for application denials were failure to comply with application requirements, either employment-related requirements (25,394 or 11%) or other requirements, such as failure to appear for interviews or failure to provide documentation (114,061 or 49.50%). Denials related to financial issues (income and resources) totaled 25,112, or 10.9% of denials. There were 9,209 (4%) denials due to residence issues. A large number of denials (56,690 or 24.6%) fell into a miscellaneous "other" category. Most of the denial codes in this category fail to identify a clear reason for the denial, since the code used requires the caseworker to manually write in a "close" reason. Other denials in this category include failure to locate the recipient, and cases where TA is denied but emergency assistance is provided.

Section (b): Case Closings and Transfers

Section (b) provides district level and statewide information on the number of case closings, and closing counts by reason for closing, for TA as a whole and for the FA and SNA categories. It also provides district level and statewide information on transfers between the FA and SNA case categories that occurred during the year.

Case closings totaled 328,438 for TA, 111,045 for FA and 217,393 for SNA. Overall, the most common reasons for TA case closings were failure to comply with program requirements not related to employment (137,814 or 42%) such as failure to recertify; financial issues (69,629 or 21.2%) such as increased earnings or other income; and, failure to comply with employment requirements (60,782 or 18.5%). As was the case for denials, a large number of closings fell into the "other" category, mostly situations where the reason for closing was not clearly defined in the closing code. The "other" category constituted 21,135 or 6.4% of closings.

Transfers from SNA to FA totaled 11,181 for the report year. Such transfers can occur for many reasons, including when an adult in an SNA case has a child, a time limited SNA case receives a time limit exemption, or an adult whose cash assistance count causes the case to be time limited leaves the household. Transfers in the opposite direction - from FA to SNA - totaled 20,775. While a portion of these cases move from FA to SNA due to TANF time limits (an average of 586 TANF cases per month reach the 60 month limit each month, and about two-

thirds of these cases transfer to SNA), there are other reasons these transfers occur, such as a child “aging out” of TANF eligibility and creating an adult-only case.

Sections (c), (d) and (e): Subsidized Work Activities, Unsubsidized Work Activities and Training and Educational Activities

This report greatly expands work activity related reporting over that provided in previous years, including the addition of district-level data. Section (c) provides data derived from both sample data and system data on the average monthly number of recipients participating in each subsidized or otherwise sponsored work activity and the average number of hours engaged in unsubsidized activities per week. Also included are systems-derived data on the number of non-exempt and exempt adult recipients in all three case types, with the non-exempts divided into those that are work limited and those that are not, and the exempts divided into three categories, disability/illness, substance abuse and other (with the other category consisting primarily of caretaker situations). For those in time limited status, the duration of that status is provided. Finally, Section c includes district level data on the number of persons receiving child care through the New York State Child Care Block Grant, divided by those on TA and those not, and federal and state expenditures on work activities, including Food Stamp Employment and Training expenditures.

Section (d) contains data on the number of TANF, SN MOE and SNA Non-MOE recipients participating in unsubsidized employment, and Section (e) contains data on the number of recipients in training and education activities.

Data Sources for Work Activities

The data source for work activity counts and hours in the activities varies by case category and region. For the rest of state region (all districts excluding New York City) all information on activities and hours regardless of case category is derived from WRTS, which receives data from CMS (the upstate system for administering work programs) and the Welfare Management System (WMS, the State’s main eligibility system). For New York City and the State as a whole, TANF and SN MOE information is derived from the quarterly disaggregated data reports submitted by New York State to the US Department of Health and Human Services for the purposes of reporting and calculating federal work participation rates. These reports contain detailed data on a representative sample of TANF and SN MOE cases, and are the only source of New York City and thus statewide data on federal work activities. It is important to note that because New York City and statewide activities data is sample based in the TANF and SNA MOE instances, rest of state and New York City figures will not sum to the statewide total. For SNA Non-MOE cases, the New York City data is based on reports submitted by the New York City Human Resources Administration (HRA), and the statewide data is a summation of the WRTS-derived data for the rest of state region and the HRA submitted reports

The time period covered for the work activity data is October 2006 through June 2007, instead of the standard report year. This is necessary because the changes in the definitions of work activities that occurred in October 2006 as a result of TANF reauthorization provisions of the Deficit Reduction Act of 2005 prevent consistent measurement of these activities, especially for TANF and SNA MOE cases, throughout the report year.

Summary of Section (c), (d) and (e) Data

Work Activities

An estimated monthly average of 8,616 TANF recipients, 3,511 SN MOE recipients and 55,989 SN Non-MOE recipients participated in subsidized or otherwise sponsored work activities (including subsidized public and private sector employment, work experience, on the job training, job search/job readiness training and community service activities). The statewide average hours of participation per week in these work activities were 18 and 21 for the TANF and SN MOE recipients, respectively. The upstate Safety Net Non MOE recipients averaged 15 hours per

week in work activities (New York City HRA does not report hours in work activities for SN Non-MOE recipients, only reporting persons in activities if they met or exceeded the hours required). Also, an estimated monthly average of 17,880 TANF recipients 14,111 SN MOE and 4,610 SN Non-MOE recipients participated in unsubsidized employment. An estimated monthly average of 4,978 TANF recipients, 2,357 SN MOE and 1,225 SN Non-MOE recipients participated in training or educational activities (including vocational education, job skills training, employment related education and school attendance). The average number of hours per week participants spent in education and training activities was 22 and 23 hours for TANF and SN MOE cases respectively, and 12 hours for upstate SN Non-MOE recipients.

Exemptions and the Work Limited

In order to assess the amount of time recipients remain in work limited (as opposed to exempt) status, we examined all adults coded as work limited at the end of the report period (June 2007) and looked backwards to see the consecutive number of months they had been in that status. Of the 12,943 adult recipients classified as work limited in that month (2,829 in TANF 3,137 in MOE and 8,155 in SN Non-MOE), 31.8% were classified work limited for 0 to 3 months, 30.8% for 4 to 6 months, 19.0% between 7 and 12 months, and the remaining 18.4% for 13 months or more.³

Child Care

During the report period, a monthly average of 120,335 children received subsidized child care under the New York State Child Care Block Grant, 62,303 in Temporary Assistance and 58,032 in the low income category.

Expenditures

Federal, state and local expenditures in support of work activities totaled \$439,694,210 for the October 2005 to September 2006 (FFY 2006) period, including \$113,792,654 in Food Stamp Education and Training funds. The FFY 2006 data is used, as opposed to the report period, to coincide with required expenditure reporting periods.

Section (f): Sanctions

Section (f) provides statewide and district level data on the monthly average number of recipients in sanction status, the type of sanction, the number of recipients that complied, and the average days to compliance in TANF, SN MOE and SN Non-MOE cases.⁴ The monthly average number of sanctioned persons for the report year was 32,714, which represents about 14.1% of the 232,484 monthly average number of adult recipients for the period. Most (27,160 or 83%) of these sanctioned persons had an employment-related sanction. Each month, an average of 2,825 persons complied with requirements and ended their sanction. The average length of time to compliance for these cases was 136 days.

Section (f) also provides district level and statewide data on the number of sanction-related fair hearings requested, the number of hearings held, and the outcomes of these

³ Duration in exempt status was not available in time for this report, because that analysis requires tracking people across multiple exemption codes over time as people may remain exempt but for different reasons (e.g., by being coded as temporarily disabled but then later coded as an applicant for disability benefits). In the work limited case, we need only follow a single work status code. We plan to report exemption duration in future reports.

⁴ Sanctions are not broken down by the FA and SNA categories used elsewhere in the report, but by the TANF, SNA MOE (time limit and qualified alien) and SNA Non-MOE ("singles") categories. This is because sanction policy varies significantly between the two latter categories, even though they are both classified as SNA.

hearings, for the full report year.⁵ These data are reported separately for total TA, FA and SNA cases. Readers of this section should note that the numbers reported are based on issues addressed, not hearings per se: more than one issue can be addressed at a hearing, and separate issues addressed at the same hearing can have different outcomes.

For the purposes of economy of presentation, Section (f) also contains fair hearings data on work related issues, since these overlap with sanction-related hearings and follow a similar format. Also included in this section are data on the number and outcomes of administrative disqualification hearings, i.e., hearings initiated by districts.

Due to the large number of issues addressed in the fair hearings section, they will not be summarized here. Readers should note, however, that outcome numbers will not sum exactly to hearing numbers since some issues initiated during the report year may still have been pending at the end of the report year.

Section (g): Case Closings

All data available to meet the requirements of this section were presented in Section (b), except for data on transitional Medicaid receipt. Here we report statewide and district level data on the percentage of persons from closed “family” cases (TANF or SN MOE cases) that were Medicaid eligible in the fourth month following case closing, in the situation where those persons have not returned to assistance. We are reporting data for two time periods in the current report year, the final quarter (October to December) of 2006 and the second quarter (April to June of 2007). For the latter period for the state as a whole, 60% percent of persons closed in these case types are Medicaid eligible four months later. There is substantial district variation on this measure, with many districts showing very high rates of Medicaid eligibility after closing.

Section (h): Substance Abuse Treatment Programs

Section (h) provides the number of TA persons residing in congregate care drug and alcohol treatment facilities at the end of the report period, and for persons entering these facilities during the first six months of the report period, the duration of their uninterrupted stay in these facilities. This information is provided at the district level and by TANF, SN MOE and SN Non-MOE case type. At the end of the report year, the number of persons receiving treatment in these facilities was 7,127, with most (6,852 or 96%) in the SN Non-MOE program. For the 6,819 individuals that entered treatment facilities between July 2006 and December 2006 (the first six months of the report period), 3,042 (44.6%) had stays that lasted six months or longer.

Section (i): Pregnancy Prevention Programs

In Section (i) the Department of Health reports on participants in TANF-funded family planning programs, including family planning education and outreach activities and direct family planning services. The outreach and education portions of these programs served 138,014 participants (including youth, parents/adults, professionals and families) in 9,371 sessions. When direct family planning services are added to this total, 170,228 persons were served (many more persons receive services not funded through TANF). A detailed description of these programs is included in the body of the report, along with district level data on the number of clients receiving any service provided by the programs.

Section (j): Disabled and Work-Limited Recipients

⁵ Fair hearings outcomes described in the report are issues affirmed (i.e., the agency’s determination is deemed correct), issues reversed (i.e., where the agency’s determination is incorrect), issues withdrawn, issues correct when made (i.e., where the agency was correct at the time the decision was made, but changes in circumstances require agency action in favor of the client) and a catch-all “other” category.

All data available to meet the requirements of this section were reported in Section (c) above.

Section (k): Food Assistance Program

The Food Assistance Program is no longer an active program.

Section (l): Domestic Violence

Section (l) reports district level and statewide data for the report year on the number of persons indicating a current danger on their domestic violence screening form, the number of persons whose domestic violence assessments showed a credible threat, the number of persons with a waiver from program requirements as a result of domestic violence, and the number of persons with new waivers granted during the year. Also reported is the number of active waivers broken down by the program requirements that are waived (e.g., time limits, employment, child support, etc.), as well as the average duration of waivers by waiver type.

For the reporting period 9,678 persons checked that there was a current domestic violence danger to them on the screening form. During the same period, 5,658 persons underwent a full domestic violence assessment where a credible threat was confirmed, and 5,331 waivers were granted.⁶ Waivers active during the period averaged five months in duration. For the report period 7,070 persons had domestic violence waivers, including persons whose waivers were granted previous to the report year. These persons had a total of 12,574 active waivers during the report year. The number of waivers exceeds the number of persons with waivers because waivers are specific to the requirement for which the waiver is granted, not a blanket exception from all program requirements. That is, a single domestic violence victim can have more than one waiver, say for instance if the person is exempted from both child support and work requirements. Note also that the number of active waivers for the year, like the number of persons with active waivers, includes those carried over from previous years.

Most domestic violence waivers were granted either from the requirement to cooperate in the establishment of child support (6,402), or from the requirement to participate in employment activities (5,562).

⁶ Note that the percentage of domestic violence interviews that result in a credible threat cannot be determined by taking the ratio of interviews that result in a credible threat to the number of persons indicating a current danger. This is because some of the difference between the number indicating a threat and the number where a credible threat was found is due to the client electing not to proceed to the interview stage.

Section (c) Subsidized Work Activities Footnotes

- 1 Figures for New York State and New York City for TANF and MOE are based on sample data from the Federal TANF and MOE quarterly disaggregated reports submitted to the US Department of Health and Human Services for the period of October 2006 to June 2007. This is the only source for New York City and thus statewide data on work participation. Data for all other districts is derived from the Welfare Reporting and Tracking System, which contains all necessary data for this purpose (there is insufficient sample size to develop work activity estimates for non-New York City districts from the federal samples). As a result, New York City and rest of state figures will not sum to the statewide total. Recipients may be participating in more than one activity. Subsidized Public Employment for New York City includes On the Job Training. Due to rounding in the calculation of averages, the total averages may not equal summation of the individual averages.

- 2 New York City data is derived from work participation reports provided by the New York City Human Resources Administration (HRA). All other data is derived from the Welfare Reporting and Tracking System. For Safety Net non-MOE cases, Community Service enrollments include persons enrolled in Drug and Alcohol Treatment or Other Treatment Plan activities. The HRA reports do not include hours in activities. Due to rounding in the calculation of averages, the total averages may not equal summation of the individual averages.

- 3 Data sources. For upstate counties, child care payments in the Welfare Reporting and Tracking System database are extracted retrospectively for each month. Low Income Day Care children are those with a case type of 20 (MA), 31 (Non-PA Food Stamps), or 40 and Services Type Suffix R (Low Income Day Care). TA Day care children are those with a case type of 11 (Family Assistance), 12 (Safety Net FP Non-Cash), 16 (Safety Net FNPCash), 17 (Safety Net FNP Non-Cash), 19 (EAF), 32 (PA/Non-PA), or 40 and Services Type Suffix S (TA Day Care) or E (EAF); or Case Type 40, Special Claim Code Blank, and Claim Category SD (EAF). For New York City, a monthly data file of all cases with child care authorizations from the Agency for Child Development (ACD) and the Human Resources Administration (HRA) is forwarded to OCFS. New York City case types are estimated using the designation ACD (low income) or HRA (TA) as provided by New York City.

Accomplishments of Family Planning Programs funded by TANF Funds for the period July 2006 to June 2007

TANF funds have been utilized to significantly expand the Department of Health's Comprehensive Family Planning and Reproductive Health Program. The Family Planning Program provides comprehensive family planning and reproductive health services including medical services, health education and outreach to low income, uninsured women.

Funding was provided to 55 family planning agencies that provide services in 210 service sites. These providers used TANF funds to continue expanded outreach and education activities in community settings, including schools, to educate children and adults regarding reproductive health and to provide programs to prevent adolescent pregnancy. TANF funding has provided an opportunity to focus the expansion of the program on state and federal priorities including:

Provision of community education, public information and counseling to prevent adolescent pregnancy and increase access to clinic services for teens who are already sexually active;

Increase outreach to women not likely to seek services, including traditionally under-served minorities and homeless and substance abusing women; and

Improved access in under-served areas to women and adolescents at risk for unintended pregnancy.

Family Planning health educators work in schools, in conjunction with community-based organizations, and other youth-serving organizations to provide education on issues such as contraception, abstinence, HIV/AIDS and sexually transmitted diseases. They participate in health fairs, organize community youth forums and parent-teen retreats, and outreach to high-risk populations. Many of the larger agencies employ several educators. Family Planning Program educators provided more than 9,371 education and training sessions for adolescents and adults, and reached an audience of 138,014 individuals in the past year.

Despite a 15 percent decrease in the total number of programs conducted during the year compared to 2005, the program activity shown in the above chart reflects the substantial (31 percent) increase in the total number of participants reached. While the number of teen oriented sessions was nearly halved since 2005, approximately 5,000 more teens participated, reflecting a nearly 13 percent increase. The number of sessions targeted at all other audiences were increased, and those targeted at parents/adults, professionals, and families reached approximately 29,000 more participants, an increase of nearly 50 percent over the previous year.

Despite a slight (1.7 percent) decrease in total clients served, Family Planning Program providers continued their -successful expanded outreach and education programs, expending all available TANF funds. The attached chart shows on a county-specific basis the 170,228 individuals served in the reporting period. The income level of the vast majority of these clients would indicate that they are eligible for TANF, and the remainder is needy. It is estimated that 20,809 pregnancies and 13,380 births would have been averted, thus attributing increases of 3.0 percent and 3.2 percent respectively to TANF funding. In combination with the funds saved from prevention of unintended pregnancies, which cost many thousands of dollars each to the state and federal governments for Medicaid prenatal and delivery costs, the TANF initiatives in family planning have more than repaid themselves in savings.

Appendix A: Welfare Reform Act of 1997 Reporting Provisions
(Section 149 of Part B of Chapter 436 of the Laws of 1997)

1. The department of social services or its successor agencies and the department of labor shall collect data related to the operation of public assistance programs including, but not limited to, information that must be submitted to the department of health and human services pursuant to the personal responsibility and work opportunities reconciliation act of 1996 (P.L. 104-193) and any other provision of federal or state law or regulations governing programs administered under title iv-a of the social security act or the social services law. Social services districts shall assist each agency in accumulating such data in accordance with instructions from the appropriate agency.

2. Each agency shall make reasonable efforts to collect and maintain the data required pursuant to this subdivision. Data collection shall begin as soon as practicable, but in no case later than upon the completion of the redesign of the welfare management system and the completion of welfare to work caseload management system. The responsible agency shall collect the data related to applicants and recipients of public assistance programs established pursuant to the personal responsibility and work opportunities reconciliation act of 1996 (P.L. 104-193) and the social services law including, but not limited to, the following:

a) Data related to applicants seeking public assistance including but not limited to:

1. Number of applicants accepted to participate in each program;
2. Number of applicants who are denied public assistance and the reason for denial;
3. Number of applicants who were previous recipients of public assistance on or after December 2, 1997 including length of time previously on assistance; reason for initial termination; length of time between termination and reapplication; and reason for reapplication; and
4. Number of applicants who have resided in the state for fewer than twelve months at the time of application.

b) Data related to recipients of public assistance including but not limited to:

1. Number of terminated recipients of public assistance and reason for termination; and
2. Number of recipients that move between public assistance programs.

c) Data related to work activities subsidized or otherwise sponsored by the department of social services, its successor agencies, the department of labor, or social services districts including but not limited to:

1. Number of recipients participating in work activities;
2. Number of recipients receiving an exemption from participating in work activities;
3. The duration of and reasons for such exemptions;
4. Number of participants receiving subsidized child care and the number of exemptions granted due to lack of available child care;
5. The type of work activities;
6. Hours of work per week per recipient;

7. Duration of enrollment in such work activity;
 8. Reason for termination from work activity;
 9. Number of requests for administrative hearings related to work activity participation including the nature of such requests by general categories and the outcome of such hearings;
 10. Number of participants receiving subsidized transportation services;
 11. Participant retention in work activities by type of work activity;
 12. Length of time before assignment to a work activity;
 13. Number of recipients changing work activity assignments and reasons for such changes; and
 14. Expenditures by social services districts in support of work activities.
- d) Data related to unsubsidized work activities including but not limited to:
1. Number of recipients hired;
 2. Initial rate of pay by either annual salary or wage basis;
 3. Retention rates;
 4. Means of obtaining unsubsidized employment including, but not limited to, referral by the social services district and direct contact with employer; and
 5. Number of participants receiving subsidized child care and/or transportation services.
- e) Data related to recipient training and education activities including but not limited to:
1. Number of recipients in training or educational activities by type of activity;
 2. Number of recipients mandated to attend training or education activities that fulfill work participation requirements;
 3. Length and duration of training or education activity including the number of hours per week and duration;
 4. Number of recipients receiving subsidized child care and/or transportation services;
 5. Number of recipients transferred to work activities;
 6. To the extent available, the number of recipients who obtain work directly from training or education activities including starting salary and employee retention rates; and
 7. Expenditures by social services districts in support of training and education activities.
- f) Data related to recipient sanctions including but not limited to:
1. Number of sanctions, by type of sanction;
 2. Number of sanctions with defined minimum period, by type of sanction;
 3. Average length of sanction until recipient compliance, by type of sanction;
 4. Amount of sanction, by type of sanction;
 5. Period of time starting on or after December 2, 1996 that the participant was in the program prior to the sanction;
 6. Number and outcome of administrative hearings related to sanctions, by type of sanction; and
 7. Number of sanctions against entire assistance unit.
- g) Data related to case closings including but not limited to:
1. Number of case closings;
 2. Reason for case closing including, but not limited to, self-termination without reason;
 3. Length of time receiving assistance on or after December 2, 1996 before case closing;
 4. On an aggregate basis, the length of time recipients do not receive public assistance in New York state following case closing occurring on or after December 2, 1996; and
 5. Number of former public assistance recipients receiving subsidized child care and/or transitional medical assistance.
- h) Data related to substance abuse treatment programs including but not limited to:

1. Number of recipients receiving substance abuse treatment services for which the cost of such services is paid for by the social services district using public assistance monies;
 2. Length of reimbursed recipient participation in treatment program; and
 3. Types of substance abuse treatment programs receiving reimbursement from social services districts.
- i) Data related to pregnancy prevention programs funded through federal monies received by the state pursuant to title iv-a of the social security act including but not limited to:
1. Number of program participants;
 2. Duration of program participation; and
 3. Types of services provided.
- j) Data related to disabled and work limited recipients of public assistance pursuant to provisions of the welfare reform act of 1997 including, but not limited to:
1. Number of persons applying for public assistance that are screened;
 2. Number of current recipients of public assistance screened;
 3. Number of persons applying for public assistance that are found to be disabled;
 4. Number of current recipients of public assistance found to be disabled;
 5. Number of persons applying for public assistance found to be work limited;
 6. Number of current recipients of public assistance found to be work limited;
 7. Duration of finding by category;
 8. Number of changes in work activity exemption status;
 9. Number and outcome of administrative hearings related to the disability screening and the determination of work activity exemptions; and
 10. Data relating to work and training and education activities pursuant to subsections c, d and e of this section.
- k) Data related to the food assistance program including but not limited to:
1. Number of applicants under eighteen years of age by chronological age;
 2. Number of applications denied by reason for denial;
 3. Number of recipients under eighteen years of age by chronological age and the average amount of food assistance benefits per recipient issued by the social services district;
 4. Number of recipients under eighteen years of age by case and by household and the average amount of food assistance benefits issued per case and per household by the social services district;
 5. Number of recipients under eighteen years of age in a case and/or in a household where other individuals in the case and/or household are in receipt of federal food stamp benefits and the average amounts of federal and state food stamp benefits issued per case and/or per house hold by social services district;
 6. Number of recipients under eighteen years of age in a case or household receiving other public assistance benefits and the average amounts of food assistance benefits issued per recipient and per public assistance case by the social services district;
 7. Number of case closings for cases where the recipient is under eighteen years of age by reason for case closing including but not limited to case closing as a result of naturalization;
 8. Number of applicants applying for food assistance benefits where the primary reason for potential eligibility is a disability as defined by provisions of this act establishing a food assistance program;
 9. Number of applications denied by reason for denial;
 10. Number of disabled recipients by chronological age and the average amount of food assistance benefits per recipient issued by the social services district;
 11. Number of disabled recipients by case and by household and the average amount of food assistance benefits issued per case and per household by the social services district;

12. Number of disabled recipients in a case and/or in a household where other individuals in the case and/or household are in receipt of federal food stamp benefits and the average amounts of federal and state food stamp benefits issued per case and/or per household by social services district;
13. Number of disabled recipients in a case or household receiving other public assistance benefits and the average amount of food assistance benefits issued per recipient and per public assistance case by the social services district including, but not limited to, receipt of federal and/or state supplemental payment made pursuant to title xvi of the social security act;
14. Number of case closings for cases where the recipient is disabled by reason for termination including but not limited to case closing as a result of naturalization;
15. Number of applicants applying for food assistance benefits where the primary reason for potential eligibility is that the applicant is elderly as defined by provisions of this act establishing a food assistance program;
16. Number of applications denied by reason for denial;
17. Number of elderly recipients by chronological age and the amount of food assistance benefits per recipient issued by the social services district;
18. Number of elderly recipients by case and by household and the average amount of food assistance benefits issued per case and per household by the social services district;
19. number of elderly recipients in a case and/or in a household where other individuals in the case and/or household are in receipt of federal food stamp benefits and the average amount of federal and state food stamp benefits issued per case and/or per household by the social services district;
20. Number of elderly recipients in a case or household receiving other public assistance benefits and the average amount of food assistance benefits issued per recipient and per public assistance case by the social services district including, but not limited to, receipt of federal and/or state supplemental payment made pursuant to title xvi of the social security act; and
21. Number of case closings for cases where the recipient is elderly by reason for termination including but not limited to case closing as a result of naturalization; and
22. Number and outcome of administrative hearings related to the food assistance program by general category.

l) Data related to the domestic violence screening process including but not limited to:

1. Number of applicants and recipients screened;
2. Number of positive findings;
3. Number of waivers by category granted as a result of a positive finding; and
4. Duration of such waiver.

3. To the extent possible, the data collection activities required by this act shall be designed to collect data in the least expensive and least time consuming manner possible. Scientifically acceptable statistical sampling methods may be used to collect and maintain data on an aggregate basis when authorized by the department of health and human services or when the commissioner of social services or commissioners of its successor agencies determines that collection of such data by any other means is not practicable or would result in significant additional costs. To the extent that statistical sampling is used to collect and maintain data, and unless otherwise required by the department of health and human services, the sample size shall be no larger than the sample size required by the United States department of agriculture for food stamp quality control purposes pursuant to the food stamp act of 1977 and subsequent amendments.

4. The commissioner of social services or commissioners of its successor agencies, and the commissioner of labor shall provide reports summarizing data collected pursuant to this act to the temporary president of the senate, the chairperson of the senate finance committee, the speaker of the assembly, and the chairperson of the assembly ways and means committee. The first such report shall be provided to the temporary president of the senate, the chairperson of the senate finance committee, the speaker of the assembly, and the chairperson of the assembly ways and

means committee no later than December 2, 1998 and annually thereafter. The commissioner of social services or the commissioners of its successor agencies, in conjunction with the commissioner of health and the commissioner of labor, shall provide the temporary president of the senate, the chairperson of the senate finance committee, the speaker of the assembly, and the chairperson of the assembly ways and means committee with an annual report summarizing data collected pursuant to this act.

5. Each agency shall provide the temporary president of the senate, the chairperson of the senate finance committee, the speaker of the assembly, and the chairperson of the assembly ways and means committee with all reports filed with the department of health and human services pursuant to the data collection and reporting requirements of the personal responsibility and work opportunities reconciliation act of 1996 (P.L. 104-193).

6. The commissioner of social services or the commissioners of its successor agencies, in conjunction with the commissioner of labor, and the commissioner of health shall develop a plan to provide the legislature with the ability to have online access to the welfare management system and the welfare to work caseload management system upon completion of the redesign of the welfare management system and implementation of the welfare to work caseload management system for purposes of obtaining aggregate program data. Such plan shall provide for security measures necessary to ensure the confidentiality of data residing on the welfare management system and the welfare to work caseload management system in conformance with all applicable federal and state laws and regulations. The plan shall be submitted to the temporary president of the senate and the speaker of the assembly no later than February 15, 1998.
